Situation	Extensive supply chain issues are impacting the supply of both infant formula and formula used for nutrition support. SickKids has been notified that <i>Nutramigen A+</i> and <i>Nutramigen A+ LGG</i> are on back order in the community until <i>June 2022</i> .
Background	Extensively hydrolyzed formula (eHF) is considered first line therapy to manage cow's milk protein allergy (CMPA) and
	may be used for the management of severe gastroesophageal reflux (GERD) or among infants with intestinal failure.
	The <i>hospital supply</i> of Nutramigen A+ and Nutramigen A+ LGG for use with admitted patients will not be affected.
Assessment	BUT, these formulae will not be available outside of the hospital either by prescription or purchase.
	This will impact any families currently at home, or any who will be discharged from the hospital in the coming weeks.
Recommendation	In patient providers: Evaluate all patients currently admitted and are receiving Nutramigen to determine if alternative interventions can be
