Diabetes Education Program

Caroline Family Health Team (CFHT)

The Diabetes Education Program at CFHT is available to community patients. Referrals to the program can be made by any physician, specialist, or the patient may self-refer. Anyone over the age of 18 with pre-diabetes, Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes are welcome. Unfortunately, pediatric patients, patients on pump therapy, or with gestational diabetes are not eligible to participate in the program.

The program focuses on all aspects of diabetes management, including nutritional/dietary management and education, physical activity education, and pharmacology. Any recommendations for medication changes/suggestions would be included in a regularly faxed note to the referring physician. If a patient requires support for insulin or GLP-1 RA starts, the team is capable of providing instruction as well as follow up more frequently/as needed to assist with dose titration.

The presentation was provided by Dr. Douglas Belton, Chief of Radiology & Diagnostic Imaging; Jessy Samuel, Director, DI, Pharmacy, IPAC & Laboratory Services; Nicole Bennett, Manager, DI and Medical Diagnostics Unit; and Dr. Mariam Ghali Eskander, Radiologist, Women's Imaging Lead.

Presentation highlights included **Medical Diagnostic Unit (MDU)**, **Imaging Services** available for MRIs, CTs, Interventional Radiology, Ultrasound, Radiology, Bone Mineral Density, and Mammography. The new **OBSP Breast Assessment Centre** includes the Complete Breast Care (CBC) Clinic dedicated to providing timely, specialized breast care by experienced specialists, new technology that provides improved image quality, and guidance by Patient Navigators.
