Ontario Lung Screening Program

St. Joseph's Healthcare Hamilton will begin offering Lung Cancer Screening starting April 15, 2024. As they launch the Ontario Lung Screening Program (OLSP) in the Hamilton Niagara Haldimand Brant (HNHB) region, they are hosting a **free**, **one hour accredited * webinar for primary care teams**.

Integrated Care Pathways: Charting a new path for Heart Failure and COPD



The February 6th Town Hall brought together health and community care providers as well as patient representatives to identify the gaps in care for Heart Failure and COPD and what improvements are needed.

As one of the 12 Ontario Health Teams selected by the Ministry of Health for acceleration to designation, one of the Burlington OHT's new strategic priorities is to co-design and implement new integrated care pathways for Heart Failure (HF) and Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD). We're excited to provide an update on our progress to date with this new work.

February 6 Town Hall

Through a collaboration with the Greater Hamilton Health Network

we have retained a consultant and hosted two Town Hall meetings. The goal was to design an ideal integrated care pathway for COPD and HF patients in Burlington and Hamilton. The first event was held on February 6th. Health and community care providers and patient representatives from Burlington and Hamilton gathered to share experiences about the current state of care for COPD and HF patients, gaps, and how they can be improved.

February 28 Town Hall

The same audience was invited to the second Town Hall on February 28th. This one focused on codesigning an ideal future pathway: how to restructure and redesign the current system to deliver more effective care. An engaged session resulted in recommendations that included a centralized platform for resources (diagnosis and management) and referrals, centralized navigation hub, intake model, as well as standardized diagnosing and assessment tools.

What did we learn?

We learned that many programs currently exist in the community to serve individuals living with COPD and HF. However, these programs remain siloed and awareness is equally challenging for providers and patients. An area for improvement identified by numerous participants is standardized care that is based on updated, evidence-based, quality standards. The lack of coordination across various providers and care settings was another gap that was identified. (continued on page 3)

Integrated Care Pathways (cont'd)

We're grateful for the active engagement of the Town Hall participants that will help contribute to enhanced care pathways for HF and COPD patients. Work is now underway to prepare a report with final recommendations.

We'll look forward to keeping you informed of further progress as details are available.

Health and community care providers assembled again on February 28th to co-design and improve the care pathways for Heart Failure and COPD.
